### 3) Technical Aspects of the competition

#### 3.1. Training Facilities & Schedule

The practice field (200 m from the FOP) will be available and operational from Sunday 18th July until Saturday 24 July. It will be open from 8:00 to 18:00h.

3.2. Number of Participants per class – (final numbers will be given during the TC meeting)

There will be NO team competition in compound women's category

#### 3.3. Competition preliminary Program (attached)

The latest competition program is shown at the end of this TC document. The final program will be handed out at the TC-Meeting. Please check regularly in the Team boxes and public information boards to be aware of any possible changes on the program.

#### 3.4. Official Practice & Warm-Up:

- Official Practice on Tuesday 20th July from 9:00 to 12:00 for all categories
- Qualification Round (30 minutes practice before the Competition).
- Individual and Team Elimination Round Practice (30 minutes before the competition)
- Individual Finals Rounds and Medal Matches Practice (1 hour before the competition, next to the finals FOP)



### 3.5. Equipment Inspection.

Equipment inspection will be run during the official practice on Tuesday 20th July. Each team will be called in alphabetical order by the DoS. The inspection will take place at the entry of the competition field. All team members must wear their team uniform, including officials. Also all spare equipment must be brought to the equipment inspection.

### 3.6. Qualification Round and information on scoring

The target assignment will be handed out latest at the Team Captains Meeting.

Qualification Round, on Wednesday 21st of July, for all disciplines, shooting 4 athletes per target, in order AB-CD.

The athletes will find an electronic score terminal (PDA terminal) at each target. In addition, in the qualification and elimination/finals rounds there will be also one paper score sheet per target, which must be filled in by the athletes themselves. For each target one athlete will enter the score in the paper score sheet; another athlete will score on the PDA terminal. All the athletes on the same target must verify that the correct scores are entered in the scorecard (this is the valid score following FITA's rules, and then double check that the scores on the scorecards and in the PDA terminal are the same).

Please instruct your athletes to sign and totally complete the score sheets before handing them back to the Organizing Committee after each round.

Byes are allowed. In case of a bye, athletes will be allowed to shoot on their own target, but no score will be recorded or allowed to be displayed.

3.7. Individual Finals Round, Saturday 24th July (Medal matches). Morning : bronze and gold medal finals will take place in the morning on the FoP. They will start with the Compound women at 9:00, then with the Compound Men, after that the Recurve Women and then the Recurve Men.

Practice for competing archers will start at 8:00 in the morning on the practice area near the finals matches area. Alternated shooting will be used for all medal matches.

### 3.8. Appeal Procedure (Form attached)

Appeal form is attached to this document.

To lodge an intention to appeal or an actual Appeal, the times indicated on the Appeal form must be followed.

The Appeal form should be given to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission. A deposit of Euro 50€ must be paid to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission, for the Appeal to be valid. If the Appeal upheld by the Jury of Appeal, the money will be returned. If the appeal is not successful, the money is retained.

### 4) Technical Matters

#### 4.1. Results system.

The scoring in the qualification round will be done by the athletes. One athlete will write down the score on the paper score sheet and another will score on a terminal. The other athletes verify that the correct scores are entered. During the Equipment Inspection the athletes will be asked to test the terminals to see if they understand the correct working of the terminals.

#### 4.2. Rules that apply in this event. EMAU rules.

- For the Team members' nomination, see the form attached to this document page
- Following EMAU rules, all teams that have more than 3 archers registered in one division, are requested to give in writing to the Chairman of the Tournament Judge Commission at least one hour before the Qualification Round starts, the names of the 3 athletes who will compete in the team event (for team qualification, Elimination Round and Finals). No substitution will be allowed after the names are given on the form. If a team has failed to give this information one hour before the Qualification Round starts, the 3 athletes with the lowest scores in the Qualification Round will be chosen as members of this team for the team ranking round, elimination & finals round.



• All athletes will go to the individual elimination rounds after the qualification round.

After this event, the EMAU circuit ranking ([www.emau.org](http://www.emau.org)) and the FITA World ranking ([www.archery.org](http://www.archery.org)) will be updated.

#### 4.3. Prize Money:

Euro 500.- for the 1st place in Recurve and Compound - Women and Men.

#### 5) Important Rules (changes and FITA Committee official interpretations).

##### 5.1. Number of arrows / ends to be shot during Elimination

For 1/32 to 1/8 eliminations, 2 ends of 6 arrows will be shot.

For 1/4 finals to Medal matches, 4 ends of 3 arrows will be shot.

Alternate shooting will be used for semi finals and Medal matches to be shot on the finals field Saturday 24th July. From 1/32 to 1/16 finals we will have 2 athletes per target. One athlete per target from 1/4 to gold.

##### 5.2. Team round procedure. (Clarification of the Shot off for Teams)

For 1/8 to bronze finals, simultaneous shooting will be used for the team matches. The gold medal matches will be alternate shooting. If a shoot off occurs in the alternates shooting medal matches, the procedure is as follow:  
(Rule clarification)

In Team Match play competition when alternate shooting is used, during the tiebreak the team that started the match will shoot all three arrows (one arrow per member) in succession and then the 2nd team will shoot their 3 arrows (one arrow per team member).

##### 5.3. Score card signature.

Following FITA rules, each scorecard needs to be correctly filled in and signed by the athlete. The athlete is responsible for the total value and each arrow value. If the scorecard is not signed, the result of this athlete may be not recorded and the athlete could have ZERO points. It is very important to make sure that all scorecards are CORRECTLY completed:

- All arrow values.

- All sums required in the scorecard (Total score, number of 10s. included Xs, and number of Xs.

- The signature of the archer and the scorer.

##### 5.4. Lost arrows.

As soon as possible, the Team Captains and/or athletes are invited to report to the Tournament Judge Commission each arrow lost from the official Practice time until the end of the competition. The DoS will administer this list.

##### 5.5. What is the Set System?

Here are the principles of the Set System for the matches until the quarterfinals:  
All matches leading into the quarterfinals consist of a maximum of 3 sets of 6 arrows per set.

The winner of each set, the athlete who gets the highest cumulative score with his six arrows, gets two (2) set points.

If the set is tied each athlete gets 1 set point.

The winner of the match is determined by the number of set points won, not the value of the arrows.

The match winner is the first to reach 4 set points.

The match will finish once the 4 set points is reached within the 3 sets.

If the match is tied; a one-arrow (only!) shoot-off will be used to break the tie. The archer whose arrow is closest to the centre (if needed it will be measured) will get 1 extra point and wins.

The athletes shoot simultaneously their arrows and have four (4) minutes to shoot 6 arrows.

For quarterfinals through medal matches, the principles are:

The match changes to a maximum 5 sets of 3 arrows per set.

The match winner this time is the first to achieve 6 points.

If the match is tied, a one-arrow shoot-off will be used to break the tie. In the tiebreak, the archer whose arrow is closest to the centre (if needed it will be measured) will get 1 extra point and wins.

For quarterfinals and semifinals, the athletes shoot simultaneously their arrows and have 2 minutes to shoot 3 arrows.

For medal matches, the athletes will shoot alternately each arrow and will have 20 seconds per arrow. In alternate shooting, the athletes trailing in the score shoot first.

To note, all the individual matches at the Olympic Games London 2012 will be played as medal matches during the World Cup).

##### What about the (regular) Team and Mixed Team Round?

Team:

In the regular team and mixed team round the matches go as follows:

Each team shoots a total of 4 ends of 6 arrows, with the three team members shooting 2 arrows each per end.

Each team will have 2 minutes to complete each end.

The total of all 24 arrows will be added to determine a total score (max score 240).

In medal matches, the teams alternate shooting. Each team member shoots 2 arrows per end, shooting only 1 arrow at a time. Teams alternate shooting after every 3 arrows.

In alternate shooting, the trailing team after every end will shoot first during the next end.



## 6) Logistical Aspects

6.1. The Hotel, the Competition field, Practice field and other facilities are all situated in one complex. The shuttle bus will be provided from “Olympiets” park-hotel to Moscow city center/ closest Metro station and back for sightseeing.

### 6.2. Meals:

Meals will be served only at the hotel according to this schedule;

Breakfast: 07:00 to 09:00 h

Lunch: 12.00 to 14.00 h

Dinner: 19:00 to 21:00 h

During the meals in the hotels & at the archery centre, water will be served free of charge.

### 6.3. Team boxes:

The team boxes are located at the main entry in the building at the reception desk.

## 7) Protocol and ceremonies

### 7.1. Opening and closing ceremonies.

The opening ceremony will take place at the hotel conference hall on July 20 at 18:30.

7.2. The awards and closing ceremony will take place on Saturday 24th July at 13:00 on the competition field.

7.3. The awards ceremony for the European Grand Prix 2010 circuit will be held during the Farewell banquet at the hotel.

## 8) Medical Related issues

A First Aid Service will be available in the Archery Venue, during all the competition. A fully equipped emergency care ambulance will be on duty throughout the tournament.



### 8.1. Doping control

Doping control will follow FITA rules (EMAU GP and World Ranking events, your athletes should bring their passports and accreditation cards to the doping control).

### 8.2. Alcohol test

According to FITA rules; Levels of alcohol might also be being tested during the competition.

## 9) Other matters of importance

### 9.1. Accreditation cards:

The accreditation card must be worn at all times in the practice and competition areas.

Only athletes competing in certain stages of the event are allowed on the Field of play, together with their coaches.

### 9.2. Forms:

All the forms attached to this TC booklet must be filled in by all the athletes and given to the OC at the accreditation office. (FITA athlete's consent form anti doping, FITA participation waiver & competitor agreement and minority of age forms)

Article 3.13.2.1: An intention to appeal when it might affect the progression of an athlete from one stage of the competition to the next, must be expressed in writing and lodged with the chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission or the Jury within 5 minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever comes first. During the Finals of match play rounds, the notice of intent to file an appeal must be given within 5 minutes of the end of the match, or prior to the start of the next match, whichever comes first. Article 3.13.2.2: The written appeal must be lodged with the Jury within 15 minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever comes first.

As in any sporting event, athletes always run the risk of injury or worse. Archery is no different. Therefore, the following waiver is currently required for participation.

In consideration of my involvement in The Event, I acknowledge and agree that:

1. I understand that participation in archery competition may involve risk of bodily injury, including but not limited to paralysis, dismemberment or even death, as well as loss of or damage to property.
2. I fully understand such dangers and knowingly and freely assume all such risk, and
3. I for myself and on behalf of my heirs, assigns and next of kin, hereby release, hold harmless and promise not to sue FITA, their Officers, Officials, Organizers, Agents, Sponsors and/or Employees and/or other representatives ("The FITA Agents"), with respect to any and all such injury, paralysis, dismemberment, death and/or loss or damage arising from my participation in the except that which is resultant of gross negligence and/or willful or wanton misconduct by FITA and/or FITA agents.
4. I promise to abide by all FITA rules, regulations, decisions and rulings, including without limitation all those relating to doping or use of drugs. I agree to submit all disputes or claims of any nature relating to the Event (including without limitation its conduct, sponsorship and my participation therein), FITA's rules, regulations, rulings and decisions on all subjects to binding arbitration before the Court of Arbitration for Sport under its statutes and regulations.

## ANTI-DOPING AGREEMENT

I, as a member of a Member Association of FITA or participating in a FITA authorised or recognised event, hereby acknowledge and agree as follows:

1. I have received information on the Anti-Doping Rules and had an opportunity to review them.
2. I consent and agree to comply with and be bound by all of the provisions of the FITA Anti-Doping Rules, including but not limited to, all amendments to the Anti-Doping Rules\* and all International Standards\* incorporated in the Anti-Doping Rules.
3. I consent and agree to the creation of my profile in WADA Doping Control Clearing House (ADAMS) or any other authorised National Anti-Doping Organisations (NADOs) similar system under FITA's agreement for the sharing of information, and to the entry on my doping control and Therapeutic Use Exemptions related data in such systems.
4. I acknowledge and agree that FITA and its Member Associations have jurisdiction to impose sanctions as provided in the FITA Anti-Doping Rules.
5. I also acknowledge and agree that any dispute arising out of a decision made pursuant to the Anti-Doping Rules, after exhaustion of the process expressly provided for in the Anti-Doping Rules, may be appealed exclusively as provided in article 13 of the Anti-Doping Rules to an appellate body for final and binding arbitration, which in the case of international level athletes is the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
6. I acknowledge and agree that the decisions of the arbitral appellate body referenced above shall be final and enforceable, and that I will not bring any claim, arbitration, lawsuit or litigation in any other court or tribunal.
